Bioprofile: Carol M. Rumack, MD, FACR – July 2010

Carol M. Rumack, MD, is a pediatric radiologist who is Professor of Radiology and Pediatrics with Tenure at the University Of Colorado Denver School Of Medicine. She received her MD at the University of Wisconsin in Madison, Wisconsin and her Pediatric internship at the University of Maryland. Her Radiology residency and Pediatric Radiology Fellowship were at the University of Colorado. Dr. Rumack was a pioneer in neonatal brain imaging with ultrasound and continues clinically to practice neonatal imaging in the high risk NICU. She has served on the Editorial boards of Pediatric Radiology, AJR and JACR. Dr. Rumack is the senior editor of the textbook, Diagnostic Ultrasound, the 4th edition will be published in 2010. She is Associate Dean for Graduate Medical Education at the University of Colorado Denver Medical School. In addition, she is Course Director for the 4th year medical student Radiology elective.

Dr. Rumack was elected the founding president of the American Association for Women Radiologists in 1981-82. Dr. Rumack received the Alice Ettinger Award from the AAWR in 2000 for her lifetime achievements in radiology and for the advancement of women in radiology.

In 1999, she was appointed by the ACR to the ACGME Residency Review committee which she Chaired from 2002-2004. She was elected to the ACGME Board of Directors. Most recently, she served as the American College of Radiology President for 2009-2010.
