CONTINUING MEDICAL EDUCATION

Cardiothoracic Surgery Update Session I

The Chapter of Cardiothoracic Surgeons organised the Cardiothoracic Surgery Update Session I – Thoracic Surgery Updates: *Surgery for End Stage Lung Failure* on Friday, 14 December 2007 at SGH Postgraduate Medical Institute. Dr Agasthian Thirugnanam and Dr Lim Chong Hee were invited to share with the Chapter Members and the Cardiothoracic trainees on *Lung Volume Reduction Surgery* and *Lung Transplantation* respectively. This session was chaired by Dr Lim Chong Hee.

Cardiothoracic Surgery Update Sessions

Table of Surgical Procedures (TOSP) Review called by Ministry of Health (MOH)

The Chapter has submitted its returns of the TOSP table to MOH for Phase 1 in April 2007 and will continue to work with MOH on Phase 2 of the TOSP review exercise as well as in finalising the codes.

Staff Registrar Scheme (SRS)

The Ministry of Health (MOH) has issued a paper in early 2007 introducing the initiative of conducting a structured diploma programme with on-the-job training as previously proposed by the Academy of Medicine, Singapore. The SRS programme is intended to accommodate foreign doctors whose specialist degrees are not recognised by the Singapore Accreditation Board and whose medical schools are not recognised by the Singapore Medical Council. This scheme also accepts local doctors who neither want to be General Practitioners nor Specialists but prefer to work long-term in public hospitals and be promoted along the career path of a registrar. With this, the Chapter plans to roll out a SRS programme for the Cardiothoracic Surgery and this programme will ultimately award a *Diploma in Cardiothoracic Surgery* conferred jointly by the Academy of Medicine, Singapore and the College of Surgeons, Singapore. More details will be announced soon.
