The 4th preparatory course will be streamlined to be more compact and precise by conducting all lectures in "case study review" mode and all clinical teachings to be bedside teachings. ASTs can expect more case studies and clinical case discussions that would help to evaluate their level of knowledge and skills and find out deficiency. 10th Asia Pacific Congress of Endoscopic and Laparoscopic Surgery – 11 to 13 August 2011

The above congress is organized by ELSA with the theme of "So Radical Today, So Obvious Tomorrow" and the Congress President is Dr Kum Cheng Kiong. Topical highlights that will be discussed at this congress are:

- New approaches like NOTES, NOTUS and SILS will be scrutinized under an 'academic microscope' and issues of safety, feasibility and outcome.
- Consensus on who should do it and who to train for Robotic Surgery.
- Cost effectiveness and patient selection in view that longer term results of using the laparoscopic approach for cancer (stomach, colon, liver, kidney, prostate, uterus, etc) should be made available.
- The possibility of combining novel Stem Cell therapies with the minimally invasive approach.
- The prospect of Metabolic Surgery in managing weight and as a way of 'curing' diabetes mellitus.

13th Congress of the Asian Association of Endocrine Surgeons – 19 to 21 March 2012

The 12th Congress of the Asian Association of Endocrine Surgeons was successfully held in Tokyo, Japan from 23-24 March 2010. Singapore is proud to host the next congress in 2012 and details will be announced when available.

Phase III Multi-Centre Open-Label Randomized Controlled Trial of Selective Internal Radiation Therapy (SIRT) Versus Sorafenib in Locally Advanced Hepatocellular Carcinoma Opens for Recruitment after Successful Completion of Phase II Trial

The majority of patients with hepatocellular carcinoma present in the advanced stages; only one-fifth are diagnosed at a sufficiently early stage to benefit from potentially curative therapies such as surgical resection, liver transplantation and radio-frequency ablation (RFA). For inoperable HCC without metastases, RFA, transarterial chemoembolism (TACE) or selective internal radiation therapy (SIRT) are usually employed. In advanced disease with metastases or when local therapy is contraindicated, sorafenib is the treatment of choice.

The Asia-Pacific Hepatocellular Carcinoma Trials Group carried out a prospective study (AHCC05) to assess tumour response and overall survival of patients with advanced HCC treated with a combination of two therapies namely, SIRT (shown to significantly regress loco-regional tumours) and sorafenib (an efficacious systemic therapy) in inoperable HCC.

This investigator-initiated AHCC05 trial headed by Prof Pierce Chow of Duke-NUS Graduate Medical School Singapore, ran between June 2008 and June 2009 and recruited 35 patients from four countries (Singapore, South Korea, Myanmar and Malaysia). The sequential combination therapy SIRT-sorafenib conferred a significant tumour response rate of 35.5% with four cases of complete regression (CR) (12%) and 8 cases of partial regression (PR) (23.5%), 15 cases of stable disease (SD) (44%) and 7 cases of progressive disease (PD) (79.5%), giving rise to a disease control rate of 79.5%. The results were presented at ASCO 2010.

Notably, the AHCC05 trial included patients who were Child-Pugh liver function class B, with major vascular invasion and extra-hepatic spread, and more than half of patients were BCLC stage C. Patients classified as BCLC stage B at baseline achieved a median survival of 73 weeks, while patients with more advanced disease (BCLC stage C) had a median survival of 35 weeks. Overall, patients had a median survival of 11.75 months, superior to outcomes with either SIRT or sorafenib therapy alone.

As a result of this successful study, Prof Chow and his colleagues managed to secure additional funding for the AHCC trials group. In June 2010 they launched a head-to-head phase III trial comparing these two efficacious therapies for locally advanced hepatocellular carcinoma.

The AHCC06 SirVeNib trial addresses patients with locally advanced, non-metastatic HCC comparing sorafenib versus SIRspheres. The aim is to determine which of these 2 effective therapies should be first-line therapy in this group of patients. The Singapore General Hospital & National Cancer Centre Singapore opened recruitment on 9th July 2010. The first patient was recruited on 12th July 2010. Currently, 8 sites have been initiated and are currently recruiting: Singapore General Hospital, National Cancer Centre Singapore, National University Hospital, Yangon & GI Centre, Auckland City Hospital, Cipto Mangunkusumo Hospital, the National Cancer Centre Mongolia and Changi General Hospital. The remainder of the 22 centers in the trial are expected to begin recruitment by June 2011.

In the previous issue of the "Chapter Connection", the SIT committee as of 1st January 2011 was announced. This newly formed committee by the Chapter of General Surgeons is the first of its kind under the College of Surgeons, Singapore (CSS). The purpose of which was to better develop the education and training role of the College. This has been successfully done in other specialist societies, for example the Singapore Urological Association. Our simple aim as members in training is to cohesively work towards developing academic and social activities, especially among the younger surgeons in training.

The SIT committee comprises mainly of ASTs who are being nominated from the various public hospitals for a term of one year. The elected chair for the 1st SIT committee is Dr Claramae Chia who is currently a 2nd year AST in Singapore General Hospital and the elected Vice-Chairman is Dr Terence Huey, a 2nd year AST in Tan Tock Seng Hospital.

In line with the future of the specialty taking a bigger role in academic surgery, one of our first projects is to create a new preparatory course focused on both clinical and system based knowledge. This is targeted for young surgical trainees who will be embarking on post-graduate examinations. We are currently looking into designing and preparing a structured syllabus for this course. Our intention is to organise the first instalment of this course towards the end of this year.
