Chapter Connection is a newsletter conceptualised and produced by the Board of the Chapter of General Surgeons with the objective of using the newsletter as a communication tool to connect its Chapter Members. The Chapter has launched its inaugural issue in January 2008 and this newsletter is now 2 years old! The Chapter Connection is widely distributed to the Chapter Members, as well as, to the Fellows and Trainees in the general surgery community at various public hospitals at no charge, with the partial funding support from the College of Surgeons, Singapore (CSS).

# New Strategies in the Nutritional Management of Postoperative Patients Dinner Symposium

In a move to provide an in-depth view on the sub-specialty of Nutritional Management, an area which is not usually being taken up by many general surgeons to study it in great degree, the Chapter had organised a symposium on *New Strategies in the Nutritional Management of Postoperative Patients* where an expert in this field, Prof Robert Martindale from the Oregon Health & Science University, was invited to speak on *New Strategies in Enteral and Parenteral Nutrition for the Management of Postoperative Patients with Organ Failure*. Together with Prof Martindale, a local surgeon who is well-versed in this area, Dr Asim Shabbir from the National University Hospital was also invited to speak on *Enteral Nutrition for Surgical Patients in Singapore – A Discussion*. The differing views and approach in managing Nutritional Management for postoperative patients had triggered a keen interest from the participants at present comprising mainly the members of the Chapter of General Surgeons as well as the members of the College of Anaesthesiologists. This symposium was held on Friday, 27 March 2009 at the Marina Mandarin Hotel. The Organising Chairperson was Dr Swaminathan I.

# Exit Examination Preparatory Course 2009 for Advanced Surgical Trainees in General Surgery

In pursuit of the encouraging feedback received from the preparatory course 2008, the Chapter of General Surgeons had organized the 2<sup>nd</sup> exit examination preparatory course for the Advanced Surgical Trainees (ASTs) in General Surgery to aid the ASTs to better prepare their exit examinations for August 2009. The preparatory course was conducted over 4 days from 30 June to 4 July 2009 (Tuesday-Saturday) at Alexandra Hospital, National University Hospital, Singapore General Hospital and Tan Tock Seng Hospital. The course was designed to comprise of interactive lectures, clinical discussions and mock VIVA of similar format as the real exit examinations, and covered core modules such as Breast, Endocrine, Upper Gastrointestinal, Vascular, Trauma, Colorectal, Hepato-pancreato-biliary, General Surgery, Head & Neck, Minimally-Invasive Surgery and Emergency Surgery & Critical Care. The mock VIVA conducted by the 5 appointed examiners on 4 July 2009 was the most popular segment (identical feedback received from last year's inaugural preparatory course) as feedback by the ASTs participated in this course.

An informal networking dinner – "Surgeons cum Trainees Night" was also organized on 3 July 2009 at Min Jiang, Goodwood Park Hotel where members of the Chapter of General Surgeons, appointed lecturers, clinical tutors and examiners for the preparatory course and the ASTs were invited to attend. The Chapter was privileged to have A/Prof Low Yin Peng, President of the CSS to grace the occasion at the informal dinner. Tokens of appreciation were given to the Organising Committee and the appointed lecturers, clinical tutors and examiners of the preparatory course. The Course Convener was A/Prof Pierce Chow and the hospital conveners were Dr Anton Cheng, A/Prof Cheah Wei Keat, A/Prof Pierce Chow and A/Prof Chia Kok Hoong representing Alexandra Hospital, National University Hospital, Singapore General Hospital and Tan Tock Seng Hospital respectively.

### PARTICIPATION IN MINISTRY OF HEALTH'S INITIATIVES

# Professional Opinion on Provision of Selected Clinical Services under the Health Services Development Programme

The Ministry of Health (MOH) through the Academy of Medicine, Singapore (AMS) had requested for professional opinion to be provided on the provision of selected clinical services under the Health Services Development Programme in January 2009. Independent reviewers were nominated from amongst the members of the Chapter of General Surgeons to review and provide feedback on specific issues related to the clinical services of the specialty.

# **Review of Levels of Medical Capability (LMC)**

All Specialty Chapters under the College of Surgeons, Singapore were invited by MOH through the Academy of Medicine, Singapore (AMS) in June 2009 to participate in the Review of Levels of Medical Capability (LMC) to provide feedback on the existing LMC manual on the medical capabilities at level 1 and 2 that are currently performed at regional hospitals versus teaching hospitals. Review and feedback included the following:

- 1. Proposed additional of new services or removal of obsolete services
- Proposed changes in terminology or description of services and/or changes in level of services
- 3. Identification of services which can only be performed under a tertiary setting
- 4. Identification of essential support services required for adequate provision of services

The Chapter of General Surgeons submitted its inputs to MOH through AMS in July 2009 and thereafter, assisted in the clarification of its inputs with MOH in October 2009.

#### Chapter Newsletter

The Chapter will continue to publish its quarterly newsletter – Chapter Connection as a communication tool between the Chapter and its Chapter Members, as well as, with all Fellows and Trainees in General Surgery. ## Exit Examination Preparatory Course 2010 for Advanced Specialist Trainees (ASTs)
