We have invited various renowned international, regional and local experts to share their experience and lecture at the conference and courses.

The Organising Committee cordially invites you to submit abstracts for poster presentation. The invitation is extended to all doctors, nurses and healthcare professionals. These may include both clinical and research topics relevant to Otology, Neurotology and Skull Base surgery and the different themes of the symposia.

ABSTRACT SPECIFICATION & FORMAT

- Abstracts must be submitted in English only.
- Abstracts should not contain more than 250 words of text in Times New Roman, size 11 pts. DO NOT use a smaller font size.
- Abstracts should be saved on at least Microsoft Word version 2003.
- The title should be in capital letters and bold print. Do not centralise.
- The authors family's family names in full, name in initials, their institutions, cities, countries, should be listed immediately beneath the abstract title, typed in upper and lower case and single-spaced without using full-stops. The presenter's name is to be underlined. DO NOT include degrees or professional titles (Porf, Dr, MDetc).
- Leave one blank line between the title/ author block and the body of the abstract.

- Abstract text must be single-spaced and justified at the left margin only. Do not leave blank lines between paragraphs. Do not indent paragraphs.
- Use of standard abbreviations is desirable. Place special or unusual abbreviations in brackets after the full word the first time it appears.
- The use of tables, graphs and other types of images in abstracts are not permitted.

ABSTRACT CONTENT

The text of the abstract must include the follow headings. These section holdings should appear in bold.

- · Objectives: State the aim(s) of study
- Materials and Methods: State the materials and methods used, as relevant
- · Results: Summarise results obtained
- Conclusion: State the conclusion(s) reached. It is not satisfactory to state, "The results will be discussed."

ABSTRACT SUBMISSION

Abstracts can be submitted electronically as a file attachment on the form and template available for download. Completed form and abstract must be emailed to abstracts@events360.com.sg

REVIEW. ACCEPTANCE & NOTIFICATION

- Receipts of submission will be acknowledged via email.
- The Scientific Committee will evaluate all abstract submissions based on quality, clarity and relevance for our audience,as well as the significance of the material.
- Presenting authors will receive an email notification of abstracts' acceptance and details of presentation in August 2010.
- All presenting authors must register for the Conference upon acceptance on their abstract(s).
- Details of the oral presentation and poster format will be provided for successful submissions.
