PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE DR CHUA MEI CHIEN



2023 has been a busy year for most of us as the COVID-19 pandemic continues to recede. The World Health Organisation declared an end to COVID-19 as a global health emergency on 5 May 2023. Borders have reopened and face-to-face meetings and conferences have returned with a vengeance. Virtual meetings are still very much part and parcel of life, and the College has leveraged on both in-person and virtual platforms to continue in our mission to improve the health and well-being of children through advocacy, and promote professional standards in child health through education.

The 11th Singapore Paediatric and Perinatal Annual Congress (11th SiPPAC) was held from 28 – 30 July 2023 with the theme "Shaping Child Health for the Future". The 16th CPCHS College Lecture was delivered by Clin Prof Victor Samuel Rajadurai on the topic "Lessons Learned from Randomized Controlled Trials in Neonatology". A highlight of the congress was the official launch of the CPCHS Clinical Practice Guidelines (CPG) on Autism Spectrum Disorder in Children and Adolescents, which will provide valuable guidance for professionals and community partners working in this space. This was followed shortly after by a CPG Symposium with highlights of various sections on 12 August 2023. The College also organised a number of webinars with topics ranging from challenges of growth to sleep issues.

With the upcoming compulsory requirements on **Continuing Medical Education (CME)** on medical ethics, the College will be organising a series of activities centred on ethical issues relevant to paediatric and neonatal practice. In particular, we are very excited about the **inaugural SiPPAC 2024 precongress ethics colloquium**, held in conjunction with the Asia Pacific Ethics Conference 2024, organised by the Centre for Biomedical Ethics, National University of Singapore. We believe the topics of the pre-congress ethics workshop are not only interesting and thought-provoking but also highly relevant to daily clinical practice.

Paediatric care is evolving. This generation of children lives in a world which is highly volatile, uncertain, complex and plagued with ambiguity. This is well reflected in the theme of the upcoming 12th edition of SiPPAC - "Navigating Paediatric Care in an Uncertain World". The conference, to be held from 7-9 November 2024, provides the perfect platform for us to gather as a fraternity to look into these challenges so as to better support our patients and their families.

The College also endeavours to lead and create an ecosystem to advance maternal and child health in alignment with Healthier SG. We hope to forge strong links within the paediatrics community and look forward to working closely with everyone to improve the health and well-being of our children in Singapore.

Formation of Section of Paediatric Allergy & Immunology

The College of Paediatrics and Child Health, Singapore approved the formation of the Section of Paediatric Allergy & Immunology (PAI) during its 19th AGM on 3 June 2023. The Pro tem Section Committee members are Prof Lee Bee Wah (Chairman), Dr Liew Woei Kang (Vice-Chairman), Dr Chiang Wen Chin (Secretary), Dr Chong Kok Wee, Dr Anne Goh, Dr Elizabeth Tham and Dr Soh Jian Yi.

With the formation, the Committee hopes to:

- a) Establish the training and credentialing requirements needed for PAI specialists with the eventual goal of formal recognition and accreditation of PAI in Singapore.
- b) Serve as a neutral body to advocate for PAI matters in Singapore as well as to provide objective expert opinion and professional advice to the Ministry of Health on all PAI-related matters.
- c) Establish standards and guidelines for PAI practice.
- d) Foster and sustain continuous professional development education in PAI.

11th Singapore Paediatric and Perinatal Annual Congress (SiPPAC)

The 11th Singapore Paediatric and Perinatal Annual Congress (SiPPAC) 2023 was a three-day event held from 28 – 30 July 2023 at the PARKROYAL on Beach Road.

The theme was "Shaping Child Health for the Future". This Congress was organised by the Singapore Paediatric Society (SPS) with support from the College and the Perinatal Society of Singapore (PSS). This event attracted close to 300 delegates comprising paediatricians, neonatologists, medical students, nurses, allied health staff, residents and trainees as well as overseas delegates.

The scientific programme comprised 10 symposia (Paediatric, Perinatal and Neonatal tracks), 2 nursing symposia and 4 lunch symposia. The CPCHS Clinical Practice Guidelines on Autism Spectrum Disorder in Children and Adolescents was also officially launched at the Congress.

A total of 57 abstracts were accepted, of which 9 were selected for Oral Presentations and 5 were selected for Poster Presentations. A total of 43 abstracts were displayed on poster panels at the event.

The CPCHS Clinical Practice Guidelines on Autism Spectrum Disorder in Children and Adolescents was successfully launched on 29 July 2023 at the 11th Singapore Paediatric and Perinatal Annual Congress (SiPPAC) 2023. Member of Parliament Denise Phua and Senior Parliamentary Secretary, Ministry of Health of Singapore, Ms Rahayu Mahzam graced the occasion.

Under the guidance of co-leads Dr Wong Chui Mae and Dr Aishworiya Ramakumar, the 2023 guidelines have been carefully developed following extensive and systematic review of the current research literature over the past 24 months by a 37-member workgroup of professionals working in various fields supporting children and adolescents on the autism spectrum in Singapore, followed by an external review and public consultation exercise conducted from 15 May to 15 June 2023.
