

38th Singapore-Malaysia Congress of Medicine

To be held from 19th to 22nd August 2004 at the Meritus Mandarin, Singapore, the theme of this year's Congress is "Continuing Professional Development and Professionalism: The Next Lap".

In line with this theme, the distinguished Sir Donald Irvine, President of UK's General Medical Council from 1995 to 2002, has agreed to deliver the 17th Gordon Arthur Ransome Oration, entitled "Patient-Centred Professionalism".

Additionally, Dr John WD McDonald, President of the Royal College of Physicians and Surgeons of Canada, will deliver the 2004 Runme Shaw Memorial Lecture on "Professionalism: An

Important Concept In Need of Nurturing".

As this is the most important scientific event of the Academy for 2004, the Chapters are making a concerted effort and will be holding their annual scientific meetings in conjunction with the Congress.

Highlights include the 14th Seah Cheng Siang Memorial Lecture, the Young Investigator's Award, the 9th Yahya Cohen Memorial Lecture, the 15th Chapter of Surgeons Lecture and the 4th Chapter of Paediatricians Lecture. Pilot Programme on Self-Appraisal

The Academy has recently launched a pilot quality initiative for Fellows. Obituary

Professor Tan Sri Ong Guan Bee, O.B.E., (1921-2004), Honorary Member of the Academy of Medicine, Singapore, passed away on 10 January 2004 at the age of 82.

From 1957 to 1963, Prof Ong served with great distinction as Surgeon-in-Charge of Kowloon Hospital. In 1964, Prof Ong assumed the University of Hong Kong's Chair of Surgery and Head of the Department of Surgery, where for 2 decades, until his retirement from the University in 1982, he spearheaded academic and clinical activities of the Department through surgical innovations and high quality research endeavours.

Prof Ong was also a prolific writer, publishing over 250 papers in addition to more than 10 books and monograph.

In recognition for his contributions to the field of medicine, he had received numerous merited honours.

Professor Ong will be dearly missed by all whose lives he touched.
