PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

As we reflect on the past year, I am proud to report that the College has continued to make significant strides in advancing best practices to ensure the health and wellbeing of children in Singapore.

In 2024, we remained committed to our mission of promoting excellence in paediatric care, education and research. We started the year with the launch of the Singapore Guidelines for Feeding and Eating in Infants and Young Children in February, in collaboration with KK Women's and Children's Hospital, at the Asia Pacific Maternal And Child Health Conference and Integrated Platform For Research In Advancing Maternal & Child Health Outcomes (IPRAMHO) International Meeting 2024. This set of guidelines, jointly developed by KKH and the College, together with representatives from healthcare agencies, provide useful information to healthcare professionals, parents and caregivers, to help children form healthy eating habits from infancy to establish a strong foundation for future health.

The College spent a large part of the year planning and organising the 12th Singapore Paediatric and Perinatal Annual Congress (12th SiPPAC). The theme was "Navigating Paediatric Care in an Uncertain World". The congress, held on 8–9 November 2024 at the Grand Copthorne Waterfront in Singapore, was a resounding success. Delegates expressed appreciation for the robust, well-structured scientific program which covered a wide variety of topics relevant to their clinical practice. Kudos to the scientific committee, ably led by Dr Stacey Tay Kiat Hong, for this commendable achievement.

The pre-conference ethics colloquium was particularly well-received. Through interactive case discussions, it provided a unique platform for participants to engage in thought-provoking conversations on ethical complexities surrounding paediatric care.

Another highlight was the 17th CPCHS College Lecture, titled "Evolving Trends in the Practice of Paediatric Cardiology", delivered with distinction by Professor Quek Swee Chye at the College Dinner.

Advancing Professionalism And Upholding Competency Standards

12th Singapore Paediatric and Perinatal Annual Congress (SiPPAC)

The 12th Singapore Paediatric and Perinatal Annual Congress (SiPPAC) took place over two days, from 8-9 November 2024, at the Grand Copthorne Waterfront in Singapore. The theme, "Navigating Paediatric Care in an Uncertain World," highlighted the challenges facing today's children, including the aftermath of the COVID-19 pandemic, the looming climate crisis, the dual impact of rapid technological advancements, and the rising prevalence of mental and metabolic health issues.

Organised by the College with support from

the Singapore Paediatric Society (SPS) and the Perinatal Society of Singapore (PSS), the event drew 332 delegates, including paediatricians, neonatologists, medical students, nurses, allied health professionals, residents, trainees, and international participants. The Congress featured three (3) plenary lectures, 80 invited speakers and chairs, 44 session topics, and three (3) lunch symposia, supported by 19 sponsors. In addition to plenary sessions, symposiums and poster sessions, there was a Young Doctors' Forum and Young Investigator Award to engage our next generation of budding paediatricians.

A total of 78 abstracts were submitted, with five (5) selected for Oral Presentations, five (5) for Poster Presentations and four (4) for Young Investigator Award. Furthermore, 65 abstracts were showcased on poster panels at the event.

The Congress also had the privilege of welcoming internationally renowned experts such as Professor Dominic Wilkinson, Professor of Medical Ethics at the University of Oxford, who delivered a lecture on "Avoiding Unnecessary Conflicts," and Professor Tomohiro Morio, Executive Vice President for Global Affairs at the Institute of Science Tokyo, who gave the Stuart Gan Memorial Lecture on "What Clinicians Can Learn from Inborn Errors of Immunity." Their participation provided valuable opportunities for knowledge exchange and collaboration.

In addition, two pre-congress workshops were held on 7 November 2024: the Paediatric Point of Care Ultrasound Workshop at The Academia and the SiPPAC Paediatrics Ethics Colloquium at Shaw Foundation NUS Alumni House, both of which were well-attended.

The congress dinner on 9 November 2024 offered a delightful opportunity for medical professionals, speakers, and guests to relax and build camaraderie in a welcoming and engaging

atmosphere. The dinner truly embodied the spirit of collaboration that defines SiPPAC, making it a memorable highlight of the congress.

The 12th SiPPAC was a tremendous success, bringing together medical professionals and thought leaders for impactful discussions on paediatric care and ethical matters. We express our sincere thanks to our distinguished speakers and faculty for their invaluable contributions, as well as to our generous sponsors for their support. A special thank you goes to the members of the Organising Committee for their unwavering efforts in making this congress possible.
