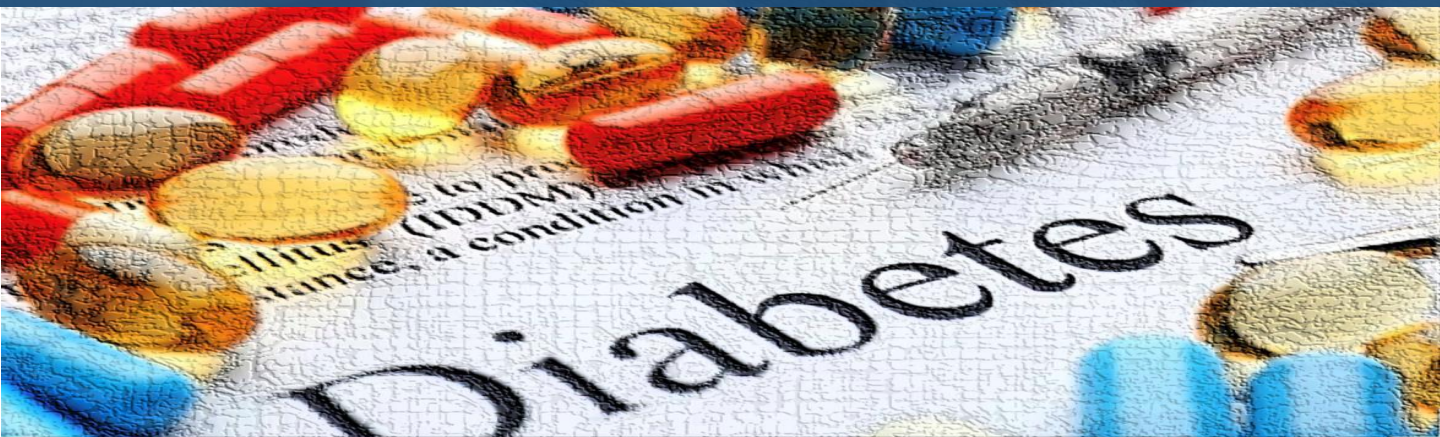

Cardio-Renal Metabolic Connection in Diabetes in the Post COVID World



Prime Minister Lee Hsien Loong, in his address at the World Health Summit Regional Meeting (Asia) in 2013, urged all countries in Asia and around the world the need to prepare for four challenges to health care, namely non-communicable chronic diseases, aging, emerging infectious diseases, and healthcare affordability.

Today, the covid-19 epidemic that took the world by storm, reminded the medical world that these challenges are indeed very real and very near. The newly emergent virus took the world by surprise and created incomprehensible fear amongst Singaporeans. Mortality was about 7-fold higher amongst the elderly and those with pre-existing chronic conditions. Co-infection had also posed diagnostic challenges. The cost to contain the covid-19 outbreak was enormous. Singapore's 2020 expansionary budget statement was projected to run a historic deficit of \$10.9 billion, the highest in 10 years. Hard choices had to be made consistently to keep healthcare sustainable. Care disruption during the pandemic is has long term implications.

The fight of diabetes is a long March. The COVID-19 curveball has shed new insights on the care of diabetes. We have put together an expert panel to show us what it takes for a home round.
